

## PROCEDURES FOR NON-EU INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

**Postgraduate** students in Greece who **do not** intend to work in parallel with their studies and hold a Visa D1.1 with an **annual duration** do not need to apply for a residence permit.

**Undergraduate** students need to follow the following procedures:

1. Before applying for a visa, they should acquire **health insurance** that can also be used to apply for a residence permit (see specifications on the [website](#)). This way, they will not need to obtain new health insurance.
2. Before coming to Greece, they should obtain a **birth certificate** translated into Greek, with the place of birth written in Latin.
3. Obtain a temporary **mobile phone number** and request a **certificate** from their mobile phone provider indicating their home address.
4. Obtain a **registration certificate** from their school, which will certify the duration of their studies, as well as the **certificate of payment** for their tuition fees.
5. Appoint a **tax representative** who will always make the relevant solemn declaration.
6. Apply for a **VAT number** (AFM) and **keyword** from the [AADE](#) website.
7. Provide this VAT number to the owner of their accommodation so that it can be included in the rental contract.
8. Accept the **rental contract** for their residence on [taxisnet](#).
9. Make an appointment at a **bank** in their area to open an account, obtain e-banking codes, and after transferring an amount of at least 400 euros to the Greek account, obtain a **bank deposit certificate**.
10. Issue the [e-paravolo](#) with code 2107 worth 150€, which can be paid through e-banking, ELTA, or a bank. The issuance and payment of the e-paravolo can be done simultaneously at the bank when opening the account.
11. Collect the **supporting documents** in .pdf form and submit a **residence permit** application on the relevant platform.
